FAMILY DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

With winter weather upon us, now is a good time for a reminder about our drop-off and pick-up procedure. Always remember to proceed SLOWLY AND SAFELY in our lot.

Before School: You may drop off your student beginning at 8:30 AM anywhere along the curb within the "horseshoe" lane (the drop-off lane that extends past the Robbins front door). Have your child exit the vehicle from the back seat of the passenger side. When school begins, best to plan for a quick hug or wave and then to morning recess or breakfast. We ask that families <u>not</u> go with their children to the playground or into the school. We also ask that you do <u>not</u> park in the lot and/or cross to the front door; only drop off your child using the drop-off lane. It's a busy time and we want everyone to stay safe! Our entry bell rings at 8:45 am and our school day begins and attendance is taken at 8:55 am.

After School: At the end of the day, students will line up by grade level or with their oldest sibling's grade level along the horseshoe lane. Please stay in your vehicle in the drop-off lane as children exit the building. As children reunite with their family's vehicle, continue to pull your vehicle forward. (We also ask that you do not park in the lot and/or cross to the front door; only pick up your child using the pick-up lane. It's a busy time and we want everyone to stay safe!) We recognize the line of cars can get long, but we're happy to report that the whole process takes between 10-15 minutes after the final bell. All students must be picked up prior to 4:00 pm as we do not have student supervision past that time. Thanks for your help in keeping all of our students safe!

VISITORS TO ROBBINS

The Eau Claire Area School District is continually implementing proactive measures that enhance safety and security in our schools. This year the district will continue to use a Visitor Management System called "RAPTOR." RAPTOR is a visitor registration system that enhances school security by reading a driver's license, comparing the information to a sex offender database, and then printing a visitor badge that includes a photo. Additionally, the system allows the schools to have instant, electronic access to a list of visitors in case of emergency or evacuation. We understand that this is new to ECASD parents and visitors to our schools. The safety of our students, staff, and guests is our highest priority and RAPTOR allows every school to know who is in the schools at any given time.

Thank you in advance for your understanding and support in enhancing the school safety protocols of the Eau Claire Area School District.

WEATHER INFORMATION

December is here! Please be sure that your child is dressed appropriately for outdoor recess. During the winter months please be sure that your child has a hat, mittens, a warm coat, boots, and snow pants. Snow pants and boots are required to play in the snow. If snow pants and boots are forgotten, students will be required to stay on the blacktop area.

Temperature Guidelines:

- If the actual temperature reaches 0 degrees or colder, students will stay inside for recess.
- If the wind chill temperature reaches 10 degrees below zero or colder, students will stay inside for recess.

SCHOOL NURSE UPDATE

Schools are public buildings and cannot be allergen free. The following guidelines are to be followed to provide a safe learning environment for students with severe food allergies. The school cannot be responsible for food brought to the school by other students and/or parent/guardians.

Family Responsibilities

- Provide the school nurse with all necessary documentation from the student's healthcare provider
- Provide emergency medications and supplies as ordered by the healthcare provider
- Work with the school nurse and school staff to develop and implement the allergy emergency plan
- Provide the school with current contact information for use in an emergency
- Educate your child in self-management (as age-appropriate) of his/her allergy including: safe and unsafe foods, how to read food labels, symptoms of allergic reactions, location and availability of his/her epi-pen

- Never trade food or share utensils with other students
- Avoid consuming food products known to contain the specific allergen or with unknown ingredients
- Be aware of the signs and symptoms of a reaction to known allergens
- Notify an adult immediately if he/she has eaten something that may contain the known allergen

DISMISSAL PLANS

Please make all arrangements for after school with your child before sending your child to school for the day. The office can take messages in the case of an emergency only, but not on a regular basis, as dismissal is an <u>extremely</u> busy time of the day. We understand that plans do change, so if your after-school arrangements are different than normal please write your child's teacher a note. If you have a dismissal schedule, please share that with your child's teacher in writing. You may place calls to teachers before 8:30 a.m. or after 3:45 p.m. Emails sent directly to teachers during the day or voice mail messages may not be read or heard until after school. For the safety of the students, please make all after school arrangements before sending your child to school. **Thank you!**

SICK CHILD GUIDELINES

If a child exhibits any of the following symptoms at school, a parent/guardian/emergency contact will be notified to come and pick up the student:

- Fever-Temperature of 100.4 F or more
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Persistent coughing
- Draining or spreading rash

Please keep your child home if he/she currently has or has had any of these symptoms in the last 24 hours.
