A student may be considered homeless if he or she is not in stable or adequate housing and is presently living:

- ♦ At another person's residence due to loss of housing, economic hardship or related circumstance
- ♦ In an emergency or transitional shelter
- ♦ In a motel, hotel, seasonal trailer park, or campground
- ♦ Separate from legal parents or guardians
- ♦ In a car, park, public space, abandoned building, substandard housing, bus or train station, or a similar setting

All students identified as living in a homeless situation have the right to:

- ♦ Immediate enrollment in school, even when records are not present at time of enrollment
- ♦ Continue attending the school of origin (school attended when student became homeless)
- ♦ Receive transportation assistance to the school of origin (if student is living outside of school's boundaries)
- ♦ Support for academic success
- ♦ Free school meals
- ♦ Assistance acquiring items needed for school
