NOTE: updates and announcements for AP Psychology students will be posted to the course Canvas page and sent via Remind and ECASD e-mail (Message Center in Skyward)

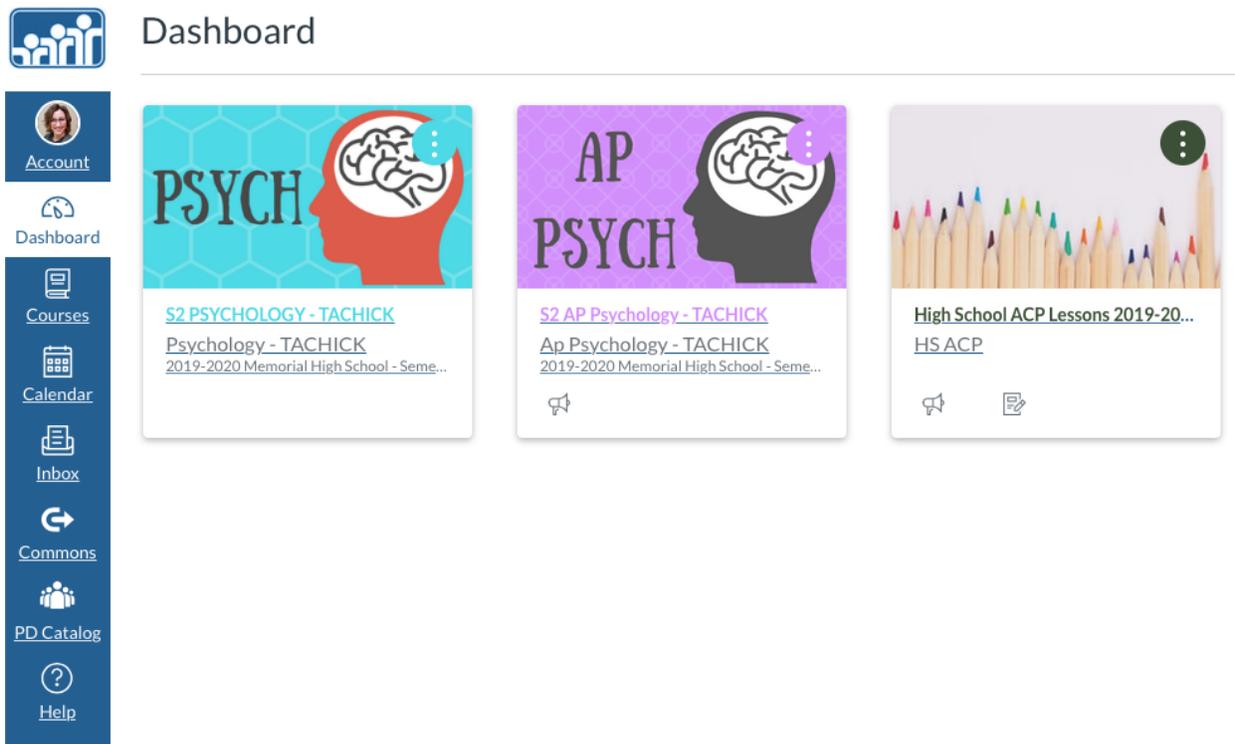

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS FOR ACCESSING REMOTE LEARNING RESOURCES ON CANVAS:

Go to <https://ecasd.instructure.com> to log-in to your ECASD Canvas account.

- **Username:** student ID number (first part of ECASD email address)
- **Password:** same password you use to log-in to school computers, access school email, etc.

Choose the AP Psychology course from the Dashboard. If you do not see AP Psychology listed, select the “Courses” tab from the left-hand menu, choose “All Courses” and find “S2 AP Psychology—TACHICK” in the list. Click on the little star to the left of the course name to turn it orange, which will add it to your Dashboard. When you return to your Dashboard, you should see the AP Psych course present.
