


In Need of Food Assistance?

Criminal Justice Field Trip

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On Friday December 8th some students from Mr. Stutzman's Criminal Justice classes took a field trip to the Eau Claire Police Department and the CVTC Police Academy. Students participated in a variety of activities such as learning how to dust for fingerprints, constructing plaster casts of shoe impressions in soil, photographing evidence, a K9 demonstration, learning about the SWAT Team and their equipment, and participating in active role playing scenarios. It was an excellent learning opportunity for students to see firsthand the many duties law enforcement officers do on a regular basis. A HUGE thank you to Officer Scott for coordinating this trip and to all the officers at the Eau Claire Police Department who took time out of their day to teach and engage with the students.
