









Mike Voth Memorial Chapter #5 VVA Scholarship

The Mike Voth Memorial Chapter #5 of the Vietnam Veterans of America has established a scholarship to provide two (2) \$1000 awards this year to graduating seniors who plan on continuing their education. This scholarship is open to all students and requires interviewing a Vietnam Era Veteran and writing an essay based on that interview. First preference will be given to family member of a VVA Chapter #5 member, followed by a student of ANY veteran of the U.S. Military. Students without a family connection to a veteran may still apply as long as their interview is with a Chapter #5 veteran sponsor. Application deadline is April 1st. Please contact Joe Heil, Treasurer, at 715-559-2945 for assistance. Applying students must:

- Be a graduating senior with a GPA of 2.8 to 3.5 from a high school anywhere within Eau Claire County, along with statement of their intended area of study. NOTE: Chapter #5 family members may apply regardless of their high school's location.
- Write an essay based on an interview with a U.S. Military Vietnam Era Veteran (any branch of service) on that veteran's service experience. Essay is to be original, typed, double spaced and will be judged on content, appearance and grammar. Essay is to reflect your understanding of the Vietnam War and its impact on the veteran interviewed.
- Have their teacher/mentor form submitted independent of their application and essay.
- Submit verification of military service for the Vietnam Era Veteran interviewed. A copy of their DD214 or verification from the County Veteran Service Office (CVSO). Entries without this will not be considered.
- Completed applications will be scored as follows:

^{*} Vietnam Era Veteran is defined as being active duty from 28 February 1961 to 7 May 1975. Veteran may have served in <u>any</u> branch of service, <u>anywhere</u> in the world; service in the country of Vietnam is not a requirement.

School Counselors will be notified and the Scholarship recipients will be notified according to their respective school's May Scholarship Awards Program. There will be <u>no</u> notification if an applicant is not chosen. Payment will be awarded <u>after</u> recipient has completed the first quarter/semester of their chosen school. Official grade transcript will be required as proof of quarter/semester completion.

Scholarship Frequently Asked Questions

What is a Vietnam Era Veteran?

A Vietnam Era Veteran is any U.S. military veteran who served on active duty between 28 February 1961 to 7 May 1975.

Can I interview someone who did not have a combat role?

Yes, most military jobs do not involve direct combat actions.

Can I interview a Vietnam Era Veteran who did not serve in South Vietnam?

Yes, The VVA believes that all U.S. veterans who served during the Vietnam Warshare a common bond and experience.

Can I interview one of my parents, step-parents or grandparents?

Yes, you may interview anyone who meets the criteria of a U.S. Vietnam Veteran.

Can I interview someone who was in the National Guard or Reserves?

If the veteran served more than six (6) months in active duty during the period identified above, you may interview them.

What kind of documentation is needed to prove that the person I interviewed is a Vietnam Era Veteran?

You need to provide proof of service for the person you interviewed. Most veteran's have a copy of their DD214 (service record) or they may have a copy of their discharge orders. If the veteran does not have proof of service, they can contact the County Veteran Service Officer (CVSO), all Wisconsin Counties have a CVSO who will be able to recreate the veteran's service record.

Will I be notified if I do not win?

No, only school counselors of winning applicants will be notified and arrangements made to present winners their award at their school's Scholarship Award Program in May.

I am a qualifying student but will not be attending an in-state school, am I still eligible?

Yes, the scholarship is for students attending any accredited school .

I am not attending a college or university but a trade school, am I still eligible?

Yes, the scholarship is for students attending any accredited school.
