## ACT/WorkKeys Assessment Days: Feb 20 and Feb 21

On Wednesday, February 20 all juniors will be taking the district sponsored ACT test. On Thursday, February 21 they will be taking the WorkKeys assessment. On both days, juniors will be admitted to testing rooms beginning at 7:55 a.m. Verbal instructions and testing will begin promptly at 8:10 a.m. **NOTE:** No student will be admitted into a testing room late. No exceptions.

On Wednesday, **ACT testing** will wrap up at 12:45 p.m. for juniors (followed by lunch) and all students (all grades) should report to their 1st period class at 1:21 p.m. Periods 2 and 3 will follow. A detailed bell schedule can be found [HERE](#).

On Thursday, **WorkKeys testing** will wrap up at 11:50 a.m. and all students (all grades) should report to their 5th hour class (including lunch)



at 12 p.m. Periods 4, 6, and 7 will follow 5. A detailed bell schedule can be found [HERE](#).

Freshmen, sophomores, and seniors are not required to be at North until after testing has wrapped up; however, all busses will run on the regular school day schedule. The commons, gymnasiums, IMC, and Learning Center will be open and supervised during testing time for students wishing to take advantage of those opportunities. Additionally, tech ed labs and art rooms will also be available to students who have obtained a pass from their teacher prior to testing days.

## Public School Open Enrollment: Feb. 4 - April 30, 2019

Wisconsin residents in grades 4K-12 may apply to attend school in a school district other than the one in which they live. For example: a child who lives in the Altoona School District could apply to attend the Eau Claire Area School District (ECASD). Students in pre-kindergarten may participate in limited circumstances; parents should call Karen Larson at 852-3003 to find out if their preschool-aged child(ren) qualify.

Students who are currently attending the ECASD through open enrollment DO NOT need to reapply.

The open enrollment application for the 2019-20 school year is February 4 – April 30, 2019. An online application will be available to the public beginning Monday, February 4, and closing at 4:00 pm on April 30, 2019. The next step to becoming a guest teacher, you must either have a current and valid teaching license or, if you do not have a valid teaching license, possess a bachelor's or associate's degree and participate in a district approved training conducted by EDUStaff. If you are interested in supporting students and teachers as a paraprofessional, either as a general school aide or a Special Education Aide, you must be 18, have a high school diploma, and complete the EDUStaff application, and attend an EDUStaff training. In the case of Special Education Aides, you must apply for an SEA license (the cost of which will be reimbursed after you sub in the district 5 times).
