### Advanced Placement (AP)

- Exposure to college level coursework
- College credit is based on your score on the AP exam (Scores of 3 or above [1-5 scale] are considered passing; some colleges require a score of 4 or 5 for a direct credit transfer

### Transcripted Credit (TC)

- Agreement between ECASD and Technical Colleges allowing you to earn "transcripted credits" for approved courses
- TC courses are actual Technical College courses, using college textbooks and materials
- Taught at the high school by ECASD staff who are Technical College certified

### Project Lead The Way (PLTW)

- National College pre-engineering program designed to provide an opportunity to apply math and science skills while exploring the broad field of engineering
- Your grade is based on class performance. Credit transfer is based on your score on the PLTW exam

# Early College Credit Program and Start College Now

- October 1<sup>st</sup> is deadline for spring semester,
- March 1<sup>st</sup> for fall semester (next fall)
- Criteria for eligibility:
  - Student cannot be credit-deficient or identified as habitual truant.
  - Must have a cumulative 2.5 GPA.
  - Cannot have any failures in the previous semester.
- The district will pay only for the courses that are successfully completed.

- School code is 500-576 (North) 500-575 (MHS)
- ACT/ACT Plus Writing
- Students should check with their schools to see if the writing test is required or go to www.actstudent.org.

#### The State pays for 1 ACT Test:

- When Early March (More info. To come)
- Where at School during the School Day

### Planning Ahead

- Fee Waiver Eligibility: If you are eligible for free/reduced lunch, you are also eligible for fee waivers on college applications and tests. See you counselor for waivers.
- Student Records: Keep a folder of information regarding plans after high school.
  - Folder should include:
    - Information from universities or technical college
    - Clubs and Activities you've participated in
    - Leadership positions you have earned throughout high school
    - Volunteer work or community service (Students are encouraged to participate in some type of service to school or community
    - Letters of Recommendation
    - Resume
    - Results of any testing done in high school
      - Aspire, Forward, PSAT, ACT, SAT, etc.
