

Head Lice Removal

There are a number of treatments for head lice. If you aren't sure which treatment to use or how to use a treatment, ask your child's school nurse or your health care provider. When using a medicine, always carefully follow the instructions contained in the package or written on the label, unless the health care provider directs otherwise.

Olive Oil/Vaseline:

- 1) <u>Saturate</u> dry hair and scalp with olive oil or Vaseline. (it **MUST** be saturated). This will smother and kill the lice.
- 2) Cover the hair with a plastic shower cap*, bandana, or towel. Leave on the hair for **eight** (8) hours (it MUST be left on this long in order to work).
- 3) After **8** hours, comb the oily hair with a nit comb and remove nits. Remove as many remaining nits as possible.
- 4) Wash the hair to remove the oil: you may need to use a liquid dishwashing soap, clarifying shampoo, or "GOOP" to remove all the oil or Vaseline. Washing the hair will wash out the dead lice.
- You may add 1 teaspoon of tea tree oil to the olive oil before you apply it to the hair. (There is a chance of skin irritation or allergic reaction.)
- *To avoid possible choking or suffocation, shower caps must be used with care only on older children and adults, and should never be used on small children.

Over-the-counter treatment products:

- Be sure to read and follow the products' directions carefully. Do not apply treatments more often than the products' directions state.
 (These are not listed in any particular order.)
