<b>Math</b>	Adding: Play Addition War: Use cards 1-10. 2 players. Deal out cards face down. Each person flips over 2 cards. Add the numbers together. Who has more? That person gets the cards.	Partners: Practice Partners of 10 by drawing ladybugs on a piece of paper with a line down the middle of its body. On each side draw dots so the total is 10. For example draw 6 dots on one side and 4 on the other: $6+4=10$ . How many partners of 10 can you make?	Practice counting from a given number. 1. Start at 3 and count to 10. 2. Start at 12 and count to 25. 3. Start at 46 and count to 70.	Story problem: The farmer has 2 pigs and 4 cows? How many animals does the farmer have all together? Story Problem: Sally the Mail Carrier had 10 letters to deliver. She delivered 6. How many letters does she have left to deliver?	
<b>Sight Words</b> are, we, can, go, and	Put a material such as shaving cream, flour, sugar, etc. in a pan and spell the sight words.	Write each sight word on a piece of paper, cut the paper between the letters, and practice putting the letters back together to make the word.	Have an adult write the sight words with a white crayon. Use watercolor paints or markers to find the mystery sight words. Then read the words.	Write each word in a sentence.
