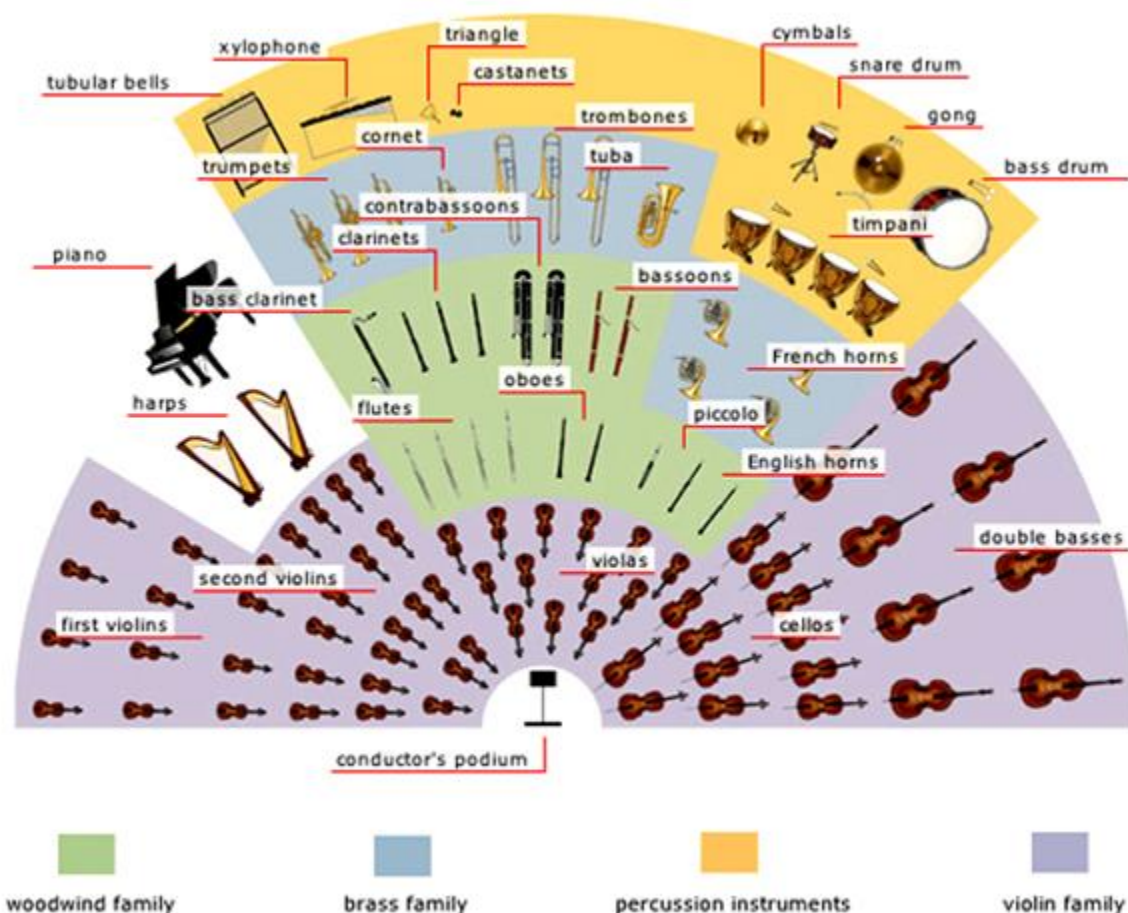


# Instruments of the Orchestra Seating Chart
