Safely dispose of prescription medicine, over-the-counter medications, ointments, patches, creams, non-aerosol sprays, vials, and pet medications at a Prescription Drug Take-Back event on Saturday, October 26th from 10a.m. to 2p.m.! Drop off sites will be available in Altoona and Eau Claire.
