Notes from December:

- Along with supporting the academic needs of our students, we are also supporting our students' social-emotional learning needs each day. After focusing on *respect*, *responsibility*, and *cooperation* to begin the year, we spent the month of December teaching about *empathy*. We describe empathy to our students as *our ability to understand and connect with the feelings of another*, which simply begins with listening. As a school, our students have made some great gains in this area that we are all so very proud of!
- Our Roosevelt PTA hosted their ninth annual *Holiday Workshop* after school on December 7, which was a really special activity for our students. Thank you to the many family members who volunteered their time, energy, and patience to help run this fun event!
- On December 11, Roosevelt students joined other ECASD schools in reducing our carbon footprint by participating in food composting during breakfast and lunch at school. This was made possible because of a grant our district received through the Eau Claire County Recycling Program.

Upcoming in January:

- January is National Mentoring Month! Thank you to the many, many mentors who connect with and support
 Roosevelt students each week. The positive impact you have on our students who need another adult

- Roosevelt Fourth Grade students will be enjoying their annual field trip to the Ice Age Trail on January 4.
- On January 5, we will have another schoolwide assembly to reflect on our work with *empathy* before introducing our focus on *perseverance* for the month of January.
- Families will receive After School Club information for our Third-Quarter Clubs on **January 8**. Registration opens **January 8** and closes on **January 18** with clubs running January 29 to March 15. Each club will be capped at 20 students per club, with priority given to our students who were put on the wait list during Second Quarter Club enrollment. Families with students who are unable to be enrolled because the club is full will be notified the week of January 22 and placed on the priority list for Fourth Quarter Clubs.
- Roosevelt families with children in fifth grade are invited to DeLong Middle School's "Fifth-to-Sixth Grade Parents Night" on **Tuesday, January 9** beginning at 6:00pm.
- Students will not attend school on January 15 in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day or on January 22-23 because of professional development.
- Students received Butter Braid fundraiser materials in December with sales ending Tuesday, **January 16**. Thank you for your help with this fundraiser, which is one of our two major funding sources for our general PTA account, with the other being our Walk-a-thon held last fall. Our PTA provides funding for so many things that benefit kids, including additional field trips for each grade-level, guest presenters, PTA mini-grants, and family engagement activities. Thank you again for helping our PTA with their work!
- Speaking of something our PTA so generously supports, we will be inviting guest presenter Mike Schneider to our school on **Friday, January 12** for a *Pint-Sized Polka* performance for grades K-2 and then grades 3-5.
- Our next *Roosevelt Night at Culvers* will be on **Tuesday, January 16**, with 10% of all sales going back to our PTA general fund.
- On **Friday**, **January 19**, we welcome local author Robin Kelley to share her presentation with grades K-2 and then grades 3-5. This was made possible through an Equity grant our school was awarded.
- Over the past two years, our *Roosevelt Neighborhood Playground Taskforce* has raised over \$80,000 to go towards new playground equipment and needed updates. With the first phase of our two-phase project installed last summer, our goal is to raise the remaining \$30K-\$40K by this spring so we are able to install the second phase of this enormous project!
