And finally, congratulations to our graduating fifth-grade students! It has been enjoyable watching you grow as individuals, and we feel privileged to have had the opportunity to work with you!

Highlights from April:

- To celebrate their hard work completing our state *Forward Exam*, all third grade, fourth grade, and fifth grade students celebrated with a dilly bar during their afternoon recess. Thank you to our students for your hard work, and to our PTA for providing our students a special treat!
- On **April 25**, our Playground Fundraising Committee hosted our first ever **Spaghetti Dinner** at the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, and it was a tremendous success. This event fed 340 people while generating another \$5,200 to go towards phase two of our playground project. Thank you to our friends at Good Shepherd Church for allowing us to use their facilities, to our amazing family members, community members, and Sam's Club volunteers, and to everyone who donated baked goods and items for our silent auction. As a culminating school wide activity for the month of April, students celebrated their own "courage" by participating in our first annual Rainbow Run. Working together with their buddy classrooms, here are the results from our Rainbow Run:

- 1st place: First Grade and Fourth Grade (340 laps averaging 3.3 laps)
- 2nd place: Second Grade and Fifth Grade (255 laps averaging 3.15 laps)
- 3rd place: Kindergarten and Third Grade (247 laps averaging 3.13 laps)

Because of their strong effort, our First Grade and Fourth Grade students earned a bonus recess to enjoy together. Great job showing great grit and courage to all our students!
