## 3. Good News Sharing

- South: Parents and Tech Forum. 10/08/18 6-9 pm at South. 45 min presentation of safe tech video and then opportunity to visit one of five breakouts dealing with kids/parents and technology.
- MHS: Chippewa Valley Book Festival "Meet the Authors" event to be held at MHS on 10/17/18 at 6 pm .
- Meadowview: Hosting "Meadowview Mile" a school fundraiser for a new modular Gaga Ball Pit.
- Montesorri: The whole school is participating in creating a beautiful Outdoor Environment. To that effort students will be planting 2700 plants in the next few weeks. They will also be hosting their fundraiser "Footslog" on October $13^{\text {th }}$, which is a race through the woods.
- Roosevelt: Parents are concerned about the decisions being made at a district level about the future of their students. They are creating a group to advocate their thoughts to the district so that there can be a true, meaningful discussion before impacting decisions are made.

## 4. Role of FAC

## 5. Title I Program

## 6. Superintendent Report

Dr. Hardebeck explained that there are concerns arising about kiddos attending after-school functions without an adult present. She explained that there are three types of groups that come to after-school activities. 1. Kiddos come with adult and stay with adult. 2. Kiddos come with adult, and then do their own thing, and then leave with adult. 3. Kiddos attend the activity without an adult.

It is this third group that is causing concerns because the staff members who are overseeing the activity are not able to supervise their activity and watch what unknown students are doing in the other part of the school or Carson Park. So, to ensure that we are being courteous to those who donate time and energy to creating an after-school experience that enriches our kiddos, the district would like to clarify how our kiddos can attend other afterschool functions in the district.
