1. Race to Nowhere Documentary

Superintendent Hardebeck attended the meeting to discuss the showing of the documentary, *Race to Nowhere*. In going to referendum, any discussion on testing elicits a lot of emotion and questions that take many months to answer and resolve. She is concerned it will be a distraction getting the referendum passed, especially showing the forums. After a lengthy discussion, the committee unanimously voted to postpone the showing of *Race to Nowhere*. The message to families and staff will state the postponement will eliminate any potential conflicts staff, families, and community members may have for attending the Referendum Information Sessions scheduled for Monday, October 10, Tuesday, October 18, Monday, October 24 and Thursday, November 3. The LEAP Committee will schedule new dates after the viewing and November 8 election.

2. LEAP Committee Structure

The members discussed committee structure and how to recruit another certified teacher (9 - 12) with Doug Diermeier, McKinley staff, resigning from the group. It was decided to send information via the District Update and also send to secondary principals to share with their staff.

3. REVIEW INNOVATION ONE PROPOSALS

Two proposals were submitted to the committee for consideration. The members split into two subgroups to discuss whether the proposals will go on to Step 2.

• South Middle School: INFINITY Zone

Subgroup 1 felt this was similar to the Arctic Zone (Northstar proposal) The INFINITY Zone proposal would emphasize the English Learners, Gifted and Talented and Learning Disabled students with 30 6th graders and 30 7th graders the first year. After that the 30 6th graders would loop and add a new group of 30 6th graders. Four lead teachers would be needed. Their goal is to partner with community members and businesses to become participatory citizens through service learning. There would be project based learning, service learning, self-paced learning, student goal setting and flexibility with their middle school schedule with specialty classes at a chunk of the day. This was approved to proceed to Step 2

• Memorial High School: Imagination Narrative

Subgroup 2 shared this proposal will integrate the EL class with Improv/Theatre during 7th hour, 2nd semester with Amber Dernbach as the instructor. The location would alternate among the Little Theatre and distance education lab at Memorial, and occasionally include select learning spaces in the Eau Claire community. This will be a hands on, learn-by-doing and by action, style of absorbing new information and vocabulary for EL students. This was approved to proceed to Step 2

4. LEAP Committee Partnerships - CESA 10

Tim Leibham connected with CESA 10 to discuss providing training for website design for office staff. Electronic/social media presence is a clearinghouse to say/show innovations happening in our school district.
