Basketball: Three-year letter-winner and two-year starter; Team MVP, 2005; First Team All-Conference and All-Northwest, 2005. Baseball: Three-year letter-winner; member of Wisconsin Baseball Coaches Association All-Star team, 2005. Jenny Rowe, Class of 1983: High School: Cross Country: Three-year letter-winner; Part of BRC Conference Championship team, 1981, 1982 and 1983; Placed 11th at State Meet, 1982. Basketball: Played varsity all three years; Team won BRC Conference Championship with a 20-2 record, 1982-83; Won Most Improved Award, 1983. Track: Three-year letter-winner; BRC Conference Champion in 1600 and 3200 Meters, 1982 and 1983; Qualified for State Meet in 1600 and 3200 Meters, 1981, 1982 and 1983; Currently holds Old Abe team record in the 1600 Meter of 5:12.24, 1983. Golden Valley Lutheran: Cross Country: Most Valuable Athlete, 1983; Finished 11th in JC Nationals, 1983. Track: Won 1600 Meters at JC Regional, 1984. College of St. Thomas: Cross Country: Two-year letter-winner; Part of NCAA Division III National Championship Team, 1986. Track: Two-year letter-winner. University of Minnesota: Baseball: Full scholarship; As a sophomore, lost to Texas A&M 3-2 in 10 innings striking out 19 while giving up three hits, but was injured warming up for his next game and never pitched again. Other: Played American Legion baseball three years, 12-2 record with 0.43 ERA with 222 strikeouts while giving up 26 hits in 104 innings; Career average in high school and American Legion pitching was two strikeouts per inning.

Sara Vine, Class of 2002: High School: Swimming: Four-year letter-winner; Captain, 2001; Old Abe team won BRC Conference Championship and Sectional Championship all four years; Individually won all BRC Conference events except one and won eight of 11 sectional events; Qualified for State Meet, 1999, 2000 and 2001, finishing as high as third individually; Broke 15 individual, relay, pool, Old Abe, and BRC Conference records, 2000 and 2001; All-State, 1999, 2000 and 2001; All-American, 2001. University of Minnesota: Partial scholarship; Three-year letter-winner; Won Outstanding Student Athlete Award twice; Academic All Big Ten Award; Held varsity record in 200 Freestyle Relay.
