WELCOME TO THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR!

I hope this letter finds our Memorial families enjoying the final days of summer vacation. With the return to school rapidly approaching, we are preparing to welcome all new and returning students to MHS for the 2024-25 school year!

Student class schedules become available on August 12th in Skyward. If you need a printed schedule, the school offices return to regular office hours on Aug. 12th, Mon-Fri from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 pm. Counselors are available on August $21^{st}-22^{nd}$ from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. to see students on a walk-in basis, no appointments needed. They can assist with schedule changes, academic questions, and other assistance you might need. Parking permits can also be purchased, starting on the 12^{th} .

The LINK orientation day for all incoming 9th graders is Tuesday, August 27th. Details can be found in this mailing. Our student leaders will assist with welcoming our 9th grade students, conduct team-building activities, and offer tours of the building. Freshmen will also meet their teachers as they walk through the building and practice their schedules and lunch shift. Our LINK program is an orientation for the 9th graders that should mitigate many immediate concerns about the transition to high school. I highly encourage all members of the class of 2028 to attend!

On Tuesday, September 3rd, <u>all</u> students will report for the first day of school. The bell schedules this year once again include time each day for enhancement, intervention, and academic support. This is the third year of our Extended Learning Time (ELT) initiative, every day between 2nd and 3rd periods. The Campus is closed during ELT so that each student can receive support and enrichment opportunities to facilitate their success. All students are expected to attend ELT and their attendance will be recorded. The 2024-25 bell schedule is available on the Memorial High School webpage and can be found in this document.

Students will find an increased building-wide emphasis regarding staff engagement and student participation. Efforts by our staff to assist students with selfregulation, active classroom engagement and focus on the daily learning targets will be found in all learning spaces. Memorial will also continue to coach students on appropriate use of technology, to better student learning. We ask your support in assisting your learner in managing their use of personal technology during the instructional day. Memorial is adding several new staff members for the upcoming year, each is sure to bring many great experiences and facilitate opportunities for students!

TEACHING ABES TO SOAR AT MEMORIAL

Thank you to students, parents, and staff for continued support of the SOAR program at Memorial High School. We are very proud of our student body and the way that they conduct themselves, both in and out of the classroom. The goal of SOAR (Safe, Organized, Accountable, Responsible) is to identify and support positive behaviors throughout the school which improves school culture, increases productive instructional time, and prepares students for a successful life beyond the walls of MHS. Throughout the school year, staff will be teaching and reinforcing building and classroom expectations so that students have a clear understanding of what they are expected to do in all areas of the building. We are so excited to start another fantastic school year. Let's SOAR Abes!

ATTENDANCE

Attendance and academic performance are closely related. To benefit fully from the instructional program, all students are expected to attend school regularly and to be on time for all classes, extended learning sessions and study halls. The high school attendance policies are designed to develop students' punctuality, self-discipline, and responsibility.

Attendance Procedures—Parents/Guardians should contact the attendance office 7:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. on the day the child will be absent from school, either for a **portion** or the **full** day of school; *OR* provide the school with a written verification of absence. Please prearrange any foreseen absence. Students are required to check out of and into the attendance office when leaving or arriving back to school. After 48 hours from the date of the absence, if no excuse is provided, the absence will be considered unexcused. Parents/guardians can create an absence for their student in the Skyward app.

Unexcused Absences—Students who are unexcused from classes and/or study halls are considered to be truant from school. Students will meet with a principal and detention(s) will be assigned during the lunch hour or after school detentions may be assigned as needed. Students failing to attend lunch hour or after school detention will be issued a truancy citation and report to Truancy Court, which is held every week at the County Court House. Questions or concerns about attendance or truancy can be directed to Assistant Principals. For more, see <u>ECASD attendance policy 431</u>. ***Parents, your assistance is vital***

While some students are referred for truancy due to unexcused absences (skipping), we are finding that more and more are chronically absent with excused absences. Excused absences are just as detrimental to a student's education as unexcused absences. State statute allows parents to excuse their child for all or part of only 10 days in a school year. Anything beyond that is considered excessive and may not be excused by the school or district. Please keep this in mind when planning vacations or family events and before excusing students for reasons other than serious or infectious illness. While we never want students to risk their health or that of others, we do want to send the message that school is a high priority and is instrumental to their future success. If your child has health or other concerns that affect regular attendance, please contact the appropriate counselor or school administrator to set up an attendance plan early in the school year.

Other ways parents can help:

- <u>Start strong</u>: Encourage good attendance from day one. Students who miss more than 2 days of school in September are much more likely to become chronically absent later in the school year. Chronic absenteeism contributes to lower grades and test scores, increased dropout risk, and lower college retention and graduation rates.
- <u>Plan to attend every day:</u> Resist the urge to pull students out of school. Breaks are built into the school calendar to be family-friendly and discourage disruption to learning. Plan your trips and activities around the <u>ECASD school calendar</u>.
- <u>Help set routines:</u> Teenagers need 8-9 hours of sleep a night. Encourage routines that allow time for homework, hobbies, and interests, but which also encourage healthy sleep patterns. Make sure that when your child powers down, the cell phone, computer, and video games do as well.
- <u>Be on time:</u> Tardiness also affects a student's success. If a student is 10 minutes late to school each day, that adds up to missing 30 hours of instruction over the course of a year.
- <u>Above all, set a good example</u>: Communicate with your child about the importance of education and that you won't excuse unnecessary absences. Don't expect them to take on childcare or other family responsibilities during the day. Education is the first priority.

FRESHMEN ORIENTATION

NOTE: Date is before school starts for ALL students on Tue. Sept. 3 Memorial seniors are excited to welcome incoming freshmen to high school through a <u>mentorship</u> <u>program called LINK</u>. *Students riding the bus will be dropped off and picked up on Keith Street (Door #4)

Bus Transportation: School bus

transportation is available for bus eligible students (students who live more than 2 miles from Memorial High School). The school bus will pick up your student <u>2 hours and 30 minutes AFTER the</u> <u>normal school year pick-up time</u>. *If your student is bus eligible, you will receive a letter indicating school year pick up time from the bus company in mid-August.*

The <u>ECASD Food and Nutrition page</u> has information about menus, pricing, free & reduced meals, etc.

Online Applications for School Year 2024-25! You can easily apply online for free or reduced price meals for the 2024-25 school year <u>HERE</u>. (needs to be submitted annually). If you fill out an online application, there is no need to fill out a paper one.

Online Meal Accounts: myschoolbucks is:

- Free: There is no fee for using the service
- **Easy:** Enrolling and funding is simple and completed online
- **Convenient:** Once your account is established, you can check balances and fund the account from your computer or phone
- **Secure:** Your personal and payment card information is protected by the most advanced internet security.
- **Recurring Payments:** With the recurring payment option, SmartPay, money will always be in your child's account. When a low balance is reached, money is automatically deposited.
- Free: There is no fee for using the service

If you enroll with the recurring payment option called SmartPay, you can set up your child(ren)'s accounts so that a payment will be initiated when their account balance reaches a certain amount. For example, you can set up a recurring payment of \$25.00 when your child(ren)'s account gets to \$8.00. Once you set this up, you will not have to go back into myschoolbucks unless you change credit/debit cards, your credit card expires, or your student changes schools. The program has been very successful, and based on parent comments, we believe it is a great benefit to our families. If you have questions, you can call myschoolbucks at 1-800-479-3531.

How to add money to student's lunch account:

Please have money in your student's account prior to the first day of school. Lunch payments may be done in two ways:

- 1. A check or cash may be placed into the drop slot at Memorial's kitchen (in the door 4 hallway near the commons). *Please do not place any monies into this slot before the last Wednesday in August.*
- Parents may use a credit or debit card to deposit money into a student account through <u>myschoolbucks</u> Have your student ID (student log-in ID number, not the Food and Nutrition PIN number) ready when going to <u>myschoolbucks</u>

Payments may take up to 48 hours to be released to the Eau Claire Area School District from your financial institution. (Please plan ahead.)

- <u>myschoolbucks</u> also has a mobile app available. Visit their website to download.
- Parents may set spending limits, recurring payments and view their students account history at <u>myschoolbucks</u>

School Breakfast: We are committed to the academic success of all our students. One of the best tools that we can use to help all students succeed is to make sure they eat a healthy and nutritious breakfast, whether at home or at school. If breakfast at home is not convenient, please take advantage of breakfast at school. Studies have shown that students who eat breakfast:

- Perform better in school
- Are tardy less often
- Are more attentive in class
- Are more likely to have better eating habits
- Are less likely to be overweight
- Have decreased absences and trips to the nurse
- Have fewer behavior problems

The School Breakfast Program is available to all students from 7:00-7:30 a.m. While it is your choice of whether your child eats breakfast at home or at school, we do encourage your student to eat a nutritious breakfast. Your student's regular lunch money account will be deducted for all breakfast meals in the same way it is for lunch meals.

ECASD GRADING SYSTEM

Memorial High School implements a grading system that includes plus/minus grades (A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+ C, C-, D+, D, D-, and F). The plus/minus system will give a more accurate reflection of academic performance, as well as provide a uniform grading scale to help with consistency in grading. First and third quarter report cards are distributed to students in their second hour classes. Semester 1 and 2 reports cards, and mid-quarter Potential Failure Notices are mailed home for students earning a D+ or below in any of their current courses. Grade point averages are computed according to a 4.0 scale.

SKYWARD

Students and families will automatically be given access to Skyward upon registration and activated status. Students will receive a Student Access account and parents will receive a Family Access account. It is recommended that families do not utilize their student's account, as these accounts are unique to the user.

Family Access

Family Access is a real-time, secure internet-based website that allows you to view your student's information. Different information is available for different grade levels. Family Access will help you stay informed about your student's progress. Your building and the district will also use Family Access as a communication tool to create a stronger relationship between families and our school community. Only one account is needed even if you have multiple students in the district. If you had an account last year, you will continue to use that username and password. You do not need to obtain a new account. To obtain your username and password, you can click on the SKYWARD SIS link at the top of all pages on our website and choose the "Forgot login/password". If your account has an email associated with it, you will receive an email with your login information. If you do not have an email address associated with your account, you will need to contact your student's school. You can also contact the Enrollment Office for assistance at 715-852-3063.

Family and Emergency Information

It is essential Memorial High School has up-to-date contact and emergency information in Skyward for students. Skyward Family Access gives families the ability to make online changes to information such as phone numbers, emails, and emergency contacts at any time during the year. Log into your Family Access Account, Click "Student Info" and then "Request Changes for [Student Name]" on the upper right. If you prefer, or do not have computer access, you can contact the secretary by email or call 715.852.6301 to update information in Skyward. If you need your address changed, ECASD suggests you complete a <u>change of address form</u> and requires that you show proof of your new address (i.e. copy or picture of utility bill, mortgage or lease *agreement*). You can bring documents to the district Enrollment Office or MHS or email the MHS secretary.





SENIOR PICTURE YEARBOOK REQUIREMENTS

Seniors, your senior picture is due by **November 1**, **2024**, for the **2025** yearbook. A Jostens upload link will be activated at the beginning of the school year. Your picture must meet the following criteria:

Head and shoulder portrait (upright) vs. a landscape image (sideways) picture. If the picture is from too far away or landscape, you must submit another photo.
Minimum resolution of 300 dpi and size of 2 inches x 3 inches. Please do not send pictures from a social media site such as *Instagram* or *Facebook*. These tend to be low-resolution images that will print blurry. Please send the original digital version.

- Saved as a .jpeg

- The **picture must not** depict violence, alcohol, drugs, or anything that would violate school rules, such as a weapon. Pictures may be uploaded via the Jostens RePlayIt Photo Submission link on the <u>Yearbook</u> <u>webpage</u> which will be activated at the beginning of the school year. For your peace of mind, if we **don't** have your picture, an email will be sent to parents/guardians after the deadline. If you receive an email regarding a missing photo, please <u>email a picture to Mrs. Campbell</u> <u>de Loyo</u> by December 1. Once school starts, a list of seniors who have sent in their senior pictures may be found on the yearbook page. Due to the high volume of submissions, the list may not be updated daily.

2025 yearbooks may be purchased online at <u>Jostens</u> or by sending a check (made out to Jostens) for **\$60.00** to Ms. Campbell de Loyo at school. To buy a yearbook online, go to the <u>MHS homepage</u>. For those who want to purchase early, **the Back-to-School price is \$51** but will increase as the school year progresses. **Buy early to save money!**

DIRECTORY INFORMATION

State law allows for the release of student directory data to parties outside the school (including military recruiters and institutions of higher education) unless families or adult students request exception to its release. Directory data means records such as student's name, recorded images, student's school, and grade level. An <u>Opt-Out Form</u> is available for families' use in restricting the release of directory data or you may log into Family Access and update preferences. Athletes need to complete the above 4 steps before the athlete may participate on the first day of practice or tryouts.

ECASD policy regarding middle/elementary students attending high school athletic events.

All students in middle school or elementary school must enter a home high school athletic event at Memorial or North High School with a paid, adult chaperone. Please note that **all individuals** must purchase a ticket to attend the game. Event staff will utilize the following expectations when supervising our middle and elementary school student fans: *Step 1: Remind the student to sit and watch the game. Step 2: Student must watch the game with his/her chaperone the rest of the game. Step 3: Removal from the game with the chaperone.*

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The purpose for this policy is to ensure the safety of students and spectators and to maintain an environment of sportsmanship. Our hope is that all middle school students will continue to be able to sit in the traditional "middle school section" of the stands and cheer on their team while their adult chaperone enjoys the game with other adults. Asking a student to sit with their adult chaperone will happen only if a student is unable to be redirected by staff supervising the stands, as indicated in Step 2.

Staying Positive at Athletic Contests:

As we enter another year of Athletic Competition, Memorial High School and the Eau Claire School District are committed to teaching our young people to set goals, strive for excellence, and to properly handle whatever adversity they encounter along the way. This aim is the same in the classroom as it is in high school athletics. Good sportsmanship by student athletes, fans, parents, and coaches is key to the success of our objective.

The greatest challenge to good sportsmanship is adversity and how the student athletes, teams, coaches, parents, and fans handle that adversity. When things are not going well, the easy response is to shift blame. In particular, to shift blame away from our team to our opponents and all too often to the officials. The focus of our cheering and support should be directed towards our athletes and our team in a <u>positive manner</u>. The negative comments to opposing teams, players, coaches, and officials should not occur, and will not be tolerated at our athletic events.

In addition, negative comments and cheering create a very uncomfortable environment for the spectators that have come out to enjoy the game and support their team. Negative and rude comments at our games create an embarrassment to our schools and to our student athletes playing the game. We are asking all our fans to keep comments positive to show support for our teams, our coaches, and our school district.

ECASD Family Pass - If your family attends numerous events, you may be interested in our Family Pass. The cost of the family pass is \$150 which allows anyone in the immediate household admittance to Memorial or North home activities that charge a fee (including plays and shows). A pass can be purchased from the principal's secretary. The pass does not qualify for WIAA tournament contests, but all regular season home contests. Remember, students get in free with their student ID for the current school year, so encourage your student to get their MHS ID on the September picture day. *(For contests prior to picture day, students can use last year's student ID for free admission).*

NURSING SERVICES

Nursing Services at Memorial High School are provided by a School Nurse that is shared with other schools. The school nurse's hours vary. The health service office is in Student Services. Additionally, a Public Health Nurse from the Eau Claire City-County Health Department can visit Memorial High School on a consultation basis to provide students and families referrals to appropriate community resources.

STUDENTS WITH HEALTH CONDITIONS

If your child has a health condition that may or will require special monitoring, a health plan, and/or medication to be administered during the school day, please contact your school nurse. Some examples of health conditions could be, but are not limited to: **Allergies, Asthma, ADHD, Cardiac Conditions, Diabetes, and Seizure Conditions.** All medical forms and health plans must be updated at the start of each school year, they do not carry over from year to year. *Diet modifications are good for the duration of the student's enrollment in the ECASD.*

ECASD Medication Procedures:

Medications should be administered to students at home, rather than at school, whenever possible. When medications are needed during the school day, the ECASD policy and guidelines must be followed. These guidelines are in place for the protection of all students.

Prescription Medications:

For **prescription medication** to be allowed in school, a completed district *Prescription Medication Form* with authorization/orders by a physician/licensed prescriber (part A) and parent/guardian consent (part B) must be on file with the school nurse. If the student will need over the counter medication in addition to prescription medication these may be added to the *Prescription Medication Form.**

*If the student will be self-carrying and self-administering their medication the self-carry box and the selfadministrator box must indicate "yes."

Each prescribed medication must be in its own pharmacy labeled package which includes the student's name, current date, the dosage, and physician/licensed prescriber's name. Over the counter medications are to be supplied in the original manufacturer's container that lists the ingredients and recommended dose. *Multiple medications may NOT be mixed together in same container.

Over the Counter Medications:

For **Over-the -Counter** medication to be allowed in school, a completed district **Medication Consent Form – Over the Counter Medication Form** with parent/guardian authorization/consent must be on file with the school nurse. Over the counter medication must be dosed in the manufacturer's recommended dose or less. If the student is taking a dose greater the manufacturer's recommended dose, then a *Prescription Medication Form** with authorization /orders by a physician/licensed prescriber (part A and parent/guardian consent (part B) is required.

*If the student will be self-carrying and self-administering their medication the self-carry box and the selfadministrator box must indicate "yes."

Over the counter medications are to be supplied in the original manufacturer's container that lists the ingredients and recommended dose.

*Multiple medications may NOT be mixed together in same container.

It is the responsibility of the student to comply with all school policies/rules relating to student alcohol/drug use.

In all cases the completed forms should be returned to the school nurse/medical school assistant. Parents are strongly encouraged to return forms to the Student Services office (to the attention of School Nurse) during the month of August to allow time for forms to be reviewed and any needed clarifications to be obtained before the first day of school. The parent/guardian assumes full responsibility for the safe delivery of medication to the health office.

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WORK PERMIT INFORMATION

Work permits are required for every new job a student has *until they turn* 16. The Department of Workforce Development's Equal Rights Division has developed a new online work permit application tool. The application is live now. A parent can access the site <u>using these instructions</u>. Payment is made directly to the department through the application, using a credit or debit card or by ACH direct withdrawal.





STUDENT DISCRIMINATION COMPLAINTS

It is the policy of the Eau Claire Area School District (ECASD) School Board to maintain an educational environment that is equitable, safe, and inclusive of all students. The Board is dedicated to the task of providing the best education possible for each student in the District. The ECASD shall not unlawfully discriminate in any of its programs, services, or activities on the basis of the student's race; color; religion; national origin; ancestry; creed; pregnancy (or related conditions); marital status; parental status; immigration status; sexual orientation; sex (including gender status, change of sex, gender identity, gender expression, or sex characteristics); or physical, mental, emotional, or learning disability (Protected Classes).

If any person believes that the District or any part of the school organization has failed to follow the law and rules of Wis. The Compliance Officer accepts reports of discrimination/retaliation from any member of the District community, including students, employees, family members, and visitors. Complaints will follow the steps identified in Board policies (2260) found <u>HERE</u> or under the Board of Ed tab on the <u>ECASD</u> website.



DRESS CODE REMINDERS

Responsibility for the personal appearance of students enrolled in ECASD shall normally rest with students and their parents/guardians. Student dress or grooming shall not, however:

- a. affect the health or safety of students
- b. disrupt the learning process within the classroom or school
- c. be destructive to school property.

To assure a healthy and safe school environment for students, the following student dress code guidelines will be enforced:

1. No student shall be permitted to wear any clothing or jewelry that contains pictures and/or writing referring to alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, sexual references, profanity, promotion of gambling, illegal drugs and/or gangs. Clothing items that cause intimidation or disrupt the learning of others are prohibited. Students will not wear clothing that defames, insults, threatens, harasses, or injures any racial or cultural groups or individuals.

2. Special requirements may be necessary to assure safety in certain areas such as physical education, art, band, science labs, kitchens, and technology education work areas, i.e. safety glasses, aprons, hair nets, etc. *The entire dress code policy can be found <u>HERE</u> in Board Policies (#443.1-Rule) under the Board of Ed tab on the district website.*

ECASD FAMILY ADVISORY COUNCIL (ECASD FAC)

Every school in the Eau Claire School District sends representatives to the FAC meetings held once a month. The purpose of the group is to facilitate better communication between parents and the District on District-wide educational issues. The Superintendent and a School Board member also participate in the meetings. Communication is based on ECASD Administration bringing information and issues to the group for discussion and input. It is also a means for the school representatives to bring items for agenda inclusion. These items are of district-wide relevance rather than issues only affecting one or two schools.
