

College Board has announced that Memorial High School in the Eau Claire Area School District (ECASD) has been named to the 2024 Advanced Placement® Program (AP®) School Honor Roll, earning **SILVER** distinction.

The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering results for students while broadening access. Schools can earn this recognition annually based on criteria that reflect a commitment to increasing college-going culture, providing opportunities for students to earn college credit, and maximizing post-secondary readiness.

The AP Honor Roll awards Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze levels to schools based on three indicators for the graduating class of 2024 (College Culture, College Credit, and College Optimization).

- College Culture-Students taking at least one AP exam during their high school journey.
- College Credit-Students earning a 3 or higher on at least one AP exam during high school.
- **College Optimization**-Students who took 5 or more AP exams during high school with at least one taken in 9th or 10th grade.

54% of Memorial's class of 2024 took at least one AP Exam during high school, 43% scored a 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam, and 12% took five or more AP Exams throughout high school!
