CURRENT QUARANTINE GUIDELINES

Thank you for your patience and graciousness as we work our way through another Covid fall. As expected, we've had a number of students isolate, quarantine, or go home because of specific symptoms or close contact with a positive case. If we have a positive Covid case in the school, it is not unusual for 5-15 students needing to quarantine. Our social distancing and mask protocols have lessened the number of close contacts, but it's still possible for students to share space for a longer amount of time, such as in the lunchroom or on the bus

If you happen to receive a call because your student is a close contact, the latest guidelines are:

OPTION 1: Quarantine for 14 days from the last date of exposure. The student does not need to test (unless they are showing symptoms) and may return to school on the 15th day, assuming no symptoms.

OPTION 2: Quarantine for 7 days from the last date of exposure. The student may test on Day 6 or 7 from an approved testing facility and return to school on Day 8 if the test is negative and they are showing no symptoms.

Other scenarios:

- If your child tests positive, it is a 10-day quarantine from the first day of symptoms, or the day of the positive test result if they are asymptomatic.
- If a family member tests positive and cannot isolate, your child would need to quarantine the 10 days with the positive person, and then another 7 (option 2 above).
- If a family member tests positive and CAN isolate, your child would need to do Option 2 above from the last day of exposure (that being Day 0).

Held the first Tuesday of every month at 6pm in the school library. Please note the November meeting is on a Wednesday due to Election Day. The public is encouraged to join.


