

Dear E2 Families,

As a team, we have discussed how to best support students following Dr. Hardebeck's message to families so we can align our teaching to meet all needs during these uncertain times. All work we provide is supplemental, meaning it is not required and does not teach new skills, but rather, the practice of the skills we have been working on this year. We do not expect you to be homeschooling your children, but we will provide resources if you choose to do so. We will keep you updated through email with the latest information we have as things tend to change quickly these days. All E2 teachers will be providing the following opportunities for students:

1. Daily Work: Each child has several online platforms and were given worksheets.
2. Supplemental Project: An example is the upcoming project, which is to research an Ancient Civilization and create a project about it.
3. Video Chats: All students will be invited to join video chats with their teacher and classmates.

Other important things to note:

- We will use Microsoft Teams for video chats. Students are not allowed to video chat or use the chat feature on the app to contact each other without teacher permission. We are not able to prevent students from doing so on our end, so we ask that you keep an eye on your child's use of the iPad.

Our top priority during this time is to keep the connections your child has with their peers and the teachers strong.
