Job Summary

The Homebound Instructor will provide instruction to students with an Individual Education Plan, (IEP), who are unable to receive a free appropriate public education in a less restrictive setting. The instructor can also provide instruction to non-IEP students on a case by case basis. The instructor is responsible for instructions, assessment, and grading of the student's work. The instructor will coordinate communication between home and school for the student.

Essential Job Functions

- Plans appropriate lessons and evaluates the student's progress.
- Delivers lessons and instruction and monitors completion.
- Communicates with the Homebound Program Coordinator, school building staff, and the student's family on a regular basis.
- Documents lessons taught and student grades and progress.
- Supports the student's transition back to school as needed.

Ancillary Job Functions

- Performs other related duties as assigned.

Required Qualifications – Required qualifications to effectively perform the job at the time of hire. An equivalent combination of education, training, and experience will be considered. Additional requirements and/or substitutions may be requested and require the approval of HR.

- Bachelor's degree in related field.
- Wisconsin Teaching Certificate.
- Reliable transportation to travel to student's home or a designated location.



Preferred Qualifications – Highly desired education, training, and/or experience that may be helpful in performing the job, if applicable.

- One or more years of classroom teaching experience.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities – May be representative, but not all-inclusive, of those commonly associated with this position.

- Troubleshooting skills.
- Ability to work a flexible schedule including weekends and after school.
