Northstar PTSA Ends Another Successful Year! - A Note from Your Co-Presidents

Thank you for your support this year, from volunteering, providing food at events, participating on a committee, supporting your student's learning at home, attending events, and so on! Northstar is a fantastic school, due in large part to our great family involvement.

Through the hard work of many, we exceeded our projected fundraising goal again this year. Our goal was to raise \$3,000.00 and we are happy to report we were able to raise \$6,195.20 – a total of \$2,895.20 more than originally planned. Note, we earned an additional \$500 from our Culver's restaurant fundraiser that we have not had the opportunity to collect and deposit yet. The \$500 will increase our income.

Much of these funds were raised through restaurant fundraisers, concessions, and our scrip program. Such success would not be possible without the support of many, many families. Thank you!

SCRIP (Holiday and Season of Giving)

The Northstar PTSA Scrip Program allows people to order gift cards at face value (no markup). The retailers sell the cards to the PTSA at a discount, thus earning a "rebate" for the PTSA (the face value of the card minus the discount).

The program continued to include two seasonal opportunities for scrip.

- The Holiday Scrip Program allowed people to order gift cards for personal use.
- The Season of Giving Scrip Program allowed families to order gift cards for families in need – thus giving to another family AND providing rebate to the PTSA. This year, the Season of Giving Gift cards were donated to the ECASD Homeless Program.

Northstar PTSA earned \$566.49 from the Holiday Scrip and Season of Giving Program.

\$1400 was raised for the Season of Giving; a total of (56) \$25 gift cards (\$1150 went to the ECASD Homeless program and \$250 stayed at Northstar.)

Sunshine Committee

The Sunshine committee was formed to acknowledge the loss of a student or teacher's primary placement or caregiver, sibling, or significant other by providing a token of sympathy of behalf of the Northstar PTSA. The goal of this committee is not to provide financial assistance, but rather to show care and concern.

An amount of \$100 was budgeted in the 2022-2023 school year from Northstar PTSA funds. Based on the situation, a gift shall be provided to the family of no more than \$50 per situation. The gift will be based on the discretion of the committee and the situation (e.g., flowers, donation to a memorial, etc.).

The following process has been established:

- 1. Loss within Northstar family occurs as outlined in the scope.
- 2. Northstar counselor is made aware of the loss.
- Northstar counselor verifies with family that notification of the loss can be communicated to Northstar PTSA.
- 4. Northstar counselor communicates to Northstar partnership coordinator.
- Northstar partnership coordinator communicates the need for a gift to executive committee at next scheduled PTSA meeting or email, based on timing.
- 6. Executive committee reviews and decides on appropriate gift.

 Northstar PTSA president or designee coordinates purchase and delivery of gift.

The committee approved and provided support three times during the 2022-2023 school year. Special approval to go above budget was received. The total funds spent for the school year were \$150.00.

PTSA Polar Fund

This is the 15th year of the Polar Fund. It is a discretionary fund, which was developed to provide emergency monies for Northstar students, and/or their families on an as needed basis. In the spirit of supporting all children, the executive board feels the Polar Fund supports our mission and the mission of National PTA. This year the executive board voted to use the \$200 discretionary fund to support a family.

Mini Grant Program

The purpose of the Northstar Middle School PTSA Mini Grant Program is to provide funding to Northstar for programs that are not provided through the normal school budget. The emphasis of mini grants is with programs that support our students and enhance learning. This includes special projects, field trip scholarships, field trip expenses and busing, speakers, authors, and more. Mini grants vary in amounts up to \$500.00. Staff wishing to request mini grant funds simply complete a mini grant application and submit it to the PTSA for approval. This year we awarded \$2,958.72 in mini grant funds. We are extremely proud of this program and the ways it benefits students in the classroom. Here are a few of the mini grants that were approved in the 22-23 school year:

- Cooking with life skills students: \$200
- DJ Board band teacher: \$300
- FACS expo class: cooking opportunities (charceuterie boards): \$200
- Mindfulness for esports club: \$60

- 6 spike ball sets (PE and events): \$384
- Library Media Center poster board library card reminder: \$107
- Student Achievement Specialist who works with kids who are struggling for variety of reasons: games to connect with kids: \$250
- Specialty seating (stools) for special education classroom flexible seating options for kids who need help with focus and learning: \$320
- Library: funds to help purchase button maker kit to be used in the library by students to promote literacy and for fun: \$142.51
- Yearbook camera purchase: \$300
