Native American Month

Today's highlight is Sokaogon (So – kay – o – gone) Chippewa Community or Mole Lake Band. Sokaogon means "Post in the Lake" people because of the spiritual significance of a post, possibly the remains of a petrified tree, that stood in nearby Post Lake. This community is also known as the Lost Tribe because the legal title to the 12-mile square reservation from the treaty of 1854 was lost in a shipwreck on Lake Superior.
